

Sanderstead Library Wild Flower Meadow

The Sanderstead Residents' Association, the local Councillors and the WI have been working alongside the Council to help maintain the library garden.

It is hoped that the roped-off area will come alive with butterflies and wildflowers!



Please do not cut the grass until the end of July, and then once more in October, which will allow the seeds to drop. Clippings should be removed and collected after cutting. The bed should not be enriched with compost.

The wild flowers should occupy between 30% and 50% of the area, and the remainder of the area will be grass.

Seeds planted:

Greater Knapweed – *Centaurea scabiosa*
Lady's Bedstraw – *Galium verum*
Bird's-foot Trefoil – *Lotus corniculatus*
Self-heal – *Prunella vulgaris*
Wild Marjoram – *Origanum vulgare*
Musk Mallow – *Malva moschata*
Salad Burnet – *Sanguisorba minor*
White Campion – *Silene Latifolia alba*
Meadow Cranesbill – *Geranium pratense*
Tufted Vetch – *Vicia cracca*
