PRIORITIES

Motor Vehicle Crime

In February, 4 Theft from Motor Vehicles and 2 Theft of Motor Vehicles took place.

We continue to see keyless car thefts. All the vehicle stolen were recovered and returned to their owners. This was due to tracking devices. These thieves target vehicles and take them to nearby location and leave it for a period time. The vehicles have been tracked and recovered with little to no damage. Look to add a tracking device to your vehicle particular for high valued vehicles such as Land Rovers. Speak to your manufactures. You can buy tracking devices such as air tags which is a cheaper alternative, but remember to keep it out of sight.

A ghost immobiliser/system is also another idea. These apparently can protect your vehicle from key cloning/hacking through using a unique code. By uses the buttons in your vehicle such as those on the steering wheel, door panels or centre console, to allow you to make a unique, changeable, disarm sequence (like a PIN code). This must first be entered before you can drive your car. By doing this unless the suspect knows the code/sequence, the vehicle will not start.

Burglary

In February, 2 Residential and 1 Business & Community Burglaries took place.

Over the last couple of months we have seen reports of suspect are accessing the garden and using ladders or other items/objects to climb and access the 1st floor and search the bedrooms only. We had a meeting with officers from Surrey Police who indicate they also seeing similar problem.

We are asking residents to look at the weak points of their homes and to upgrade their security. Don't leave anything that could be used to access your home. Suspects have taken property such as jewellery and money. All of these items are generally kept in the bedroom, so look to store your valuables somewhere else which is secure and out of sight.

We aim to visit all burglary victims to ensure we record and use information for intelligence purposes to prevent further offences. We will continue to liaise with our intelligence team and surrounding local police teams to combat these burglaries and conduct further patrols in uniform and in plain clothes.

Youth Engagement

We continue to engage with youths as often as we can, so the youth community gets to know their local police team. We patrol routes to and from schools, including surrounding areas. School patrols are conducted around the school area and places where students congregate to prevent crime and anti-social behaviour and help keep students safe on their way home from school.

OTHER NEWS

Cannabis Factory

This month police were contacted by a neighbour in Wentworth Way regarding his a smell of cannabis. Coming from an address Police attend and found the whole house was converted into cannabis factory in total 6 rooms, it has been linked to several other cannabis factories found within the last 1-2 years. Neighbours have seen a black vehicle arriving weekly at the address with males carrying black bin bags to and from. If anyone has any further information regarding please contact the team.

How to spot a cannabis factory? What to look out for:


- 1. Strong, sickly smells
- 2. Windows are constantly covered
- 3. High levels of condensation
- 4. Lots of visitors at unsociable hours
- 5. Rocketing electricity bills
- 6. Bright lights day and night
- Excessive Security
- 8. When it snows, the snow melts on the roof.
- Constant buzz of ventilation
