PRIORITIES

Motor Vehicle Crime

In March 9 Theft from Motor Vehicles and 2 Theft of Motor Vehicles took place.

We have seen a slight raise in theft from a M/V this month. Particularly number plate theft. What to do if your number plates have been stolen? The first step you should take when you discover that your number plates have been stolen, is to report it straight away to the authorities. This could be the DVLA or the police. By reporting, you are alerting the police to the fact that your plates could be used in criminal activity.

Can you drive your car if the number plates have been stolen? The short answer is no. There are no circumstances in which it is legal to drive your car (on UK roads) without a number plate on the front and rear. Realistically, there is no way to be fully safe from theft. No matter how many precautions you take. Look to park in busy, well-lit areas as it's less likely for crimes to occur. Use anti-theft screw kits which will make it harder for thieves to steal.

Burglary

In March, 3 Residential and 0 Business & Community Burglaries took place.

We may have only had three residential burglaries and only two of those had property taken, but when you look at the cost of what was taken, it amounts to ten of thousands of pounds. We are still seeing reports of suspects accessing homes through a second floor bedroom window.

Why are burglar going to the effort to break into second floor window? They will target the bedroom as this is where home owners will keep jewellery, cash and other small valuable items which are easy to carry. Burglars may also do this to avoid being detected by a burglary alarm as some alarms only cover the downstairs and upstairs hallway. You may wonder how would someone get in through second floor window?

- Climbing a top a fence that meets the side of the house.
- Trees next to the house can be climbed and using the branches.
- Using something sturdy as a leg. You own property/items left in the garden or in outbuilding/shed such as ladders, furniture, tables, bins etc.

Youth Engagement

We continue to engage with youths as often as we can, so the youth community gets to know their local police team. We patrol routes to and from schools, including surrounding areas. School patrols are conducted around the school area and places where students congregate to prevent crime and anti-social behaviour and help keep students safe on their way home from school.

OTHER NEWS

Team Change

We recently had a change in the South Neighbourhood teams. Acting Inspector Andy Smith has taken over for the south neighbourhood teams. Here is what he had to say:

"My Name is Andy Smith and I am the Acting Inspector for the south neighbourhood teams having taken over from Cathy Thomas. I have worked for the Met since 2007 starting as a PCSO spending 6 years in Croydon across various wards, In 2013 I became a police officer where I was the ward officer for Fairfield. In 2017, I passed my promotion process to Sergeant and went off to Wandsworth but Croydon called me back and in 2020 I moved back to take over 3 wards in the north of the borough. I am very driven to improve the relationships that we as the police have with yourselves and I know that as an organisation we have a long way to go in order for us to rebuild the trust which has been severely damaged over the past few years, I hope you will continue to work with us as we move forwards".

Cannabis Factory

Police responded to a call to a burglary call at an address in Beechwood Road. Police arrived at an address, but officers soon established that the venue was in fact a cannabis factory. The victim/occupier was therefore arrested for cultivation of cannabis. There are believed to be over 300 cannabis plants at the venue. Investigation is still on-going.


