CANNABIS FACTORY ADVICE

We have seen a few cannabis factories in Sanderstead this year. How to spot a cannabis factory? What to look out for:

- 1. Strong, sickly smells
- 2. Windows are constantly covered
- 3. High levels of condensation
- 4. Lots of visitors at unsociable hours
- Rocketing electricity bills 5.
- 6. Bright lights day and night
- 7. **Excessive Security**
- 8. When it snows, the snow melts on
- 9. Constant buzz of ventilation

PRIORITIES

Motor Vehicle Crime

In June, O Theft from Motor Vehicles and 3 Theft of Motor Vehicles took place.

Roll reverser for last month. This time Sanderstead had zero theft from motor vehicles. Though the numbers are great. We ask everyone to remain vigilant, keyless car thefts was seen again this month. All the thefts have mainly taken place late at night to the very early hours of the morning.

Look to add a tracking device to your vehicle particular for high valued vehicles such as Land Rovers. Speak to your manufactures. You can buy tracking devices such as air tags which is a cheaper alternative, but remember to keep it out of sight.

A ghost immobiliser/system is also another idea. These apparently can protect your vehicle from key cloning/hacking through using a unique code. By uses the buttons in your vehicle such as those on the steering wheel, door panels or centre console, to allow you to make a unique, changeable, disarm sequence (like a PIN code). This must first be entered before you can drive your car. By doing this unless the suspect knows the code/sequence, the vehicle will not start.

Burglary

In June, 1 Residential and 0 Business & Community Burglaries took place.

Glad to report Sanderstead only had one residential burglary in June. As the long summer days are upon us, more and more of us are out and about enjoying the sunshine. Unfortunately, home burglaries also increase by 10% in the summer months. Unlocked or open windows helps the opportunistic burglar get in and out of your property without being noticed.

So, don't be a victim! Just carry out a few little checks before you leave your property:

- Close and lock all windows
- Secure all back doors
- Close and lock all the gates around your property

Outdoor thefts, unsurprisingly increase in the summer months, with gardening tools most popular items to steal. It's important to feel safe in your own home. Homes with no security measures are five times more likely to be burgled than those with simple security measures in place.

Anti-Social Behaviour

The team continues to work hard to reduce all forms of Anti-Social Behaviour on the ward. The team regularly patrols areas that have come to our attention involving ASB/drug related issues. During our routine ASB patrols, the team stopped and searched a male in Wentworth Way. As a result of the search, the team found a small quantity of cannabis in his possession. As this was the suspects second offence, he was issued with a penalty notice for disorder and fined. Next time he will be arrested.

The latest 'Ward Panel Meeting' was conducted on Monday 12th June. The priorities and promises were presented along with crime figures and trends. It was agreed that the 'Priorities' would change and the team would look to focus on ASB. The next meeting will be at All Saints Church on 19th September. 
