Engaging with the community - St Pauls' and the Macular Society

On Thursday, March 7th, our Chair Paul Voden visited St. Paul's Church to deliver an engaging talk to the Cassandra Group, which convenes weekly to provide meals for the elderly and vulnerable in our community. In July 2023, our treasurer, Julian Roche, also presented his talk to the Macular Society which is a charity that gathers to offer support and companionship to those affected by macular conditions.

They both discussed the purpose of the Neighbourhood Watch and explained the support provided by the CBNWA to the local community, with an emphasis on how important it is for everyone to stay vigilant, speak up about crime and not be a bystander, to keep the neighbourhood safe. They both provided tips on how to stay safe online. For example, they advised them to avoid online scams by not giving out personal information and not trusting everything they see. They also mentioned that legitimate businesses often incorporate your last name into what they write to you - and won't be calling - so you know you can trust them.

They explained what steps to take to protect your safety when out and about, such as not carrying all of your valuables in one place and keeping your bags close to your chest in front of you so that you can see them at all times.



Their talks were very well-received, and had gotten the groups engaging, with some people even signing up for our newsletter to stay updated on our latest news and activities!







Park Hill Showcase

On Saturday the 9th of March, Kate Clark and Paul Voden from the CBNWA attended the Parkhill Showcase in which they shared a table with Graham Lyon, the chair of the Parkhill and Whitgift Safer Neighbourhoods Ward Panel.

The day brought a lively atmosphere, with local groups offering refreshments to attendees. Each table had an animal-shaped toy, which attracted families to participate in a competition for their children to match the animals to each of the tables. The event was a great success and allowed us to connect with more people in the local community to share information about the Neighbourhood Watch and how we endeavour to keep Croydon safe. Kate and Paul distributed copies of the previous Croydon Eye to provide updates on our activities and relevant crime prevention advice.







Police Cadets

The Croydon Police Cadets have been working hard and shown exceptional dedication in the last 6 months!

In 2023, they won the fiercely competitive London-Wide Police Cadets competition, showcasing their parading and handling various crime scene scenarios, such as road traffic accidents. Their victory is truly commendable.

Recently, at St. Mary's School, the Police Cadets were engaged in a discussion about which areas of Croydon they would avoid, brainstorming potential solutions to improve these areas under the guidance of PC Pitt. In the upcoming months, they will collaborate with our CBNWA coordinators to bring their ideas to life, ensuring a safer environment for all in our borough!

Community Safety Success

In recent news, on the 5th of April, a car was stolen in the Sanderstead ward. With thanks to our Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) cameras around the borough the driver was stopped on the 22nd of May and the car has now been reunited with its owner. One of the ward's key priorities is to reduce motor vehicle crime including theft, damage and anti-social driving. This is made possible with our ANPR cameras.

The Safer Neighbourhoods Teams (SNT) officers are also doing regular patrols in anti-social behaviour hotspots to deter this behaviour and promote safer driving. In the Norbury wards, officers are also taking action, to address concerns raised by locals by pulling over speeding vehicles in the specified areas. These collective efforts are aimed at creating a safer environment within our community.







Protecting yourself from fraudulent activity

With a total of £1,516,880.41 being lost to those across Croydon due to fraudulent activity in May, it is as important now as ever to stay vigilant in protecting your money. There are many different types of fraud, and it's important to be able to identify them so we can do our best to avoid them in the future.

Rogue traders - otherwise known as "Cold Callers" - are currently on the rise in the Croydon Borough. These individuals may approach your door and use pressure tactics to convince you to pay large amounts for unnecessary work on your property, such as plumbing and guttering. Frequently lacking the necessary skills in their trades, they can end up causing more harm than good to your home

To avoid any unwanted damage to your property, do not engage with people who tell you about work that needs to be done. If in doubt, make sure to go through trusted sites where traders have their certifications - for example, 'Trust Mark', 'Which? Trusted Traders' and 'Buy with Confidence'.





There have also been a large number of 'authorised push payment fraud' reported in the borough. This is when scam callers pretend to be a part of an official organisation and may ask you to transfer your money into a "safe account" or try to obtain your bank details by asking you to confirm them.

If you receive one of these calls, ask the person for information such as their name, position and bank. Then end the call immediately to give yourselves time to confirm this information using a trusted independent source, such as your bank's website. Remember, only criminals will try to rush or pressure you. Never give out your bank details if someone is asking you to 'confirm' them, the Police, Bank or any other trusted organisation will never ask you to do this.



TAKE FIVE - Before parting with your money or personal information, you can always check with another person to discuss any concerns.

CHALLENGE - Could this be fake? It's okay to take your time to verify any information.

Only criminals will try to rush or panic you.

PROTECT - If you think that you have been a victim of fraud, contact your bank immediately, and report it to Action Fraud online at **www.actionfraud.police.uk** or by calling **0300 123 2040**.

Coffee and registration will start from 8:30 with the main event taking place from 9:00 am until 3:15 pm with the AGM following from 3:15 to 4:00 pm.




Update on Neighbourhood Policing

Starting from Monday the 24th of June, there will be updates within the Croydon Neighbourhood Team. As a result of the Metropolitan Police's Strongest Ever Neighbourhood Policing (SENP) program expansion, there will be four instead of three Safer Neighbourhood Inspectors in Croydon. The SENP aims to enhance the neighbourhood policing program and will impact the entire Met policing area, not just the Croydon borough.

Furthermore, closer collaboration between schools and neighbourhood teams is expected in September. This collaboration is crucial as issues within a neighbourhood are often linked to events within schools.
